♥ **Jeffrey S. Dome, MD, PhD**  
Chief, Division of Oncology  
Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders, Children's National Medical Center  
Professor of Pediatrics, George Washington University School of Medicine

Dr. Jeffrey Dome was a member of the National Wilms Tumor Study Committee before it merged to become the Renal Tumor Committee of the Children's Oncology Group (COG) in 2002. From 2002-2006, he served as Vice-Chair of the COG Renal Tumor Committee and Chair of the Renal Tumor Biology Committee. Since 2006, he has been Chair of the COG Renal Tumor Committee. Dr. Dome is also Chair of the COG therapeutic study for high-risk renal tumors, which includes anaplastic Wilms tumor, clear cell sarcoma of the kidney, renal cell carcinoma, and malignant rhabdoid tumor.

Dr. Michael P. La Quaglia is the Chief of the Pediatric Surgical Service in the Department of Surgery at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center. He specializes in the treatment of cancer in children and adolescents, with a particular interest in Wilms tumor and bilateral Wilms tumor. He is the Chairman of the Surgery Committee for the Children's Oncology Group and is a member of the PDQ Pediatric Treatment Editorial Board, which writes and reviews PDQ summaries on Wilms tumor.

Dr. Elizabeth J. Perlman is the central pathology reviewer for the Children's Oncology Group Renal Tumor Committee. In that role she reviews over 90% of all pediatric renal tumors diagnosed in the United States. She also has an active laboratory that investigates the molecular classification of Wilms tumor and identifies molecular pathways that may be targeted for their therapy.
